Bob and Myrna McDonald were present to speak to Council regarding their property located at 5 Tamarack Road. They requested their delegation be In Camera, however were informed that Council wishes to always have an open and transparent process. The McDonald's received their tax assessment notice and found the word "contamination" used to refer to their property. Their concerns were voiced publicly at the Annual General Meeting in May, but not with their support. They are concerned about resale value and with their safety. When they dig in their yard, they are finding a layer of foul smelling substance about two feet below ground level. The McDonald's would like closure on the issue. Is there contamination? And if so, what is the Town prepared to do about it? They would like assurances that their property is safe. They feel the Town is responsible for safety of lots, and it's not the responsibility of the purchasers. The necessary tests should be performed by the Town to confirm there are no toxic consequences associated with the property as a result of the proximity to the old landfill site.

TOWN OF CLARESHOLM PROVINCE OF ALBERTA **BYLAW # 1532**

A Bylaw of the Town of Claresholm to amend Bylaw #1525 being a bylaw setting out land uses for the Town of Claresholm.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and proper pursuant to the provisions of Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, Chapter M-26, that the Council of the Town of Claresholm shall issue a Bylaw to amend its existing Land Use Bylaw.

NOW THEREFORE under the authority and subject to provisions of Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, Chapter M-26, the Municipal Council of the Town of Claresholm duly assembled does hereby enact;

1. The Town of Claresholm Land Use Bylaw #1525 shall be amended as follows:

LAND USE MAP

That portion of BLOCK 127 which lies to the west of the easterly 1650 feet of the said block 127, to the east of block 130 on plan 404R, to the north of ninth avenue, and to the south of division avenue, both on plan 404R. Excepting that portion bounded as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the southern limit of division avenue with the eastern limit of said block 130 on plan 404R, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said block 130 a distance of 330 feet, thence easterly, parallel with the southern limit of division avenue on said plan 404R a distance of 660 feet, thence northerly parallel with the eastern boundary of said block 130 on plan 404R to intersection with the southern limit of division avenue thence westerly, along the southern limit of division avenue to the point of commencement. PLAN 147N, be amended by changing the "R1" (Single Detached Residential) designation to an "I2" (Service Industrial) designation.

- 3. This Bylaw shall take effect on the date of final passage.
- 4. Bylaw #1525 is hereby amended.

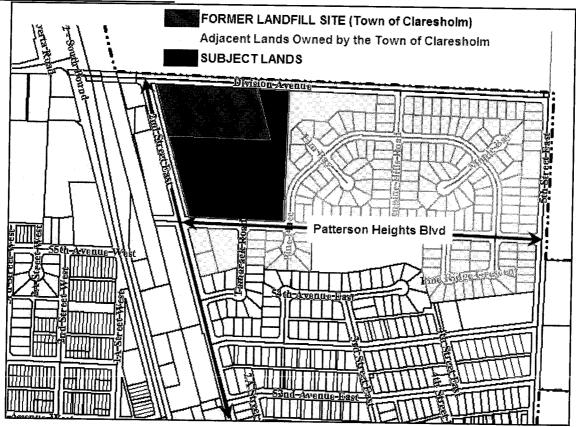
SYNOPSIS

SUBJECT: Environmental Assessment Information - 5 Tamarack Road

Thank you for your recent letter of response to our request for an environmental assessment on our property at 5 Tamarack Road. Unfortunately your response does not provide us with the information we require.

Since the last Annual General Meeting no less than four individuals have asked us if our property at 5 Tamarack Road is contaminated from the old landfill located to the north of the Tamarack subdivision. News travels fast in a small community. As a result of the Annual General Meeting discussion about Tamarack property contamination it is now common knowledge in the Town of Claresholm that the Tamarack subdivision may be contaminated.

Our principal concern is that toxicity in the soil at 5 Tamarack Road and / or in the underground water from the landfill site may be hazardous to our health. Secondarily, should we ever decide to sell our property citizen suspicion of a toxic presence on the property undoubtedly will negatively impact on the resale value of the property. We have invested too much into the property to have that happen.

We purchased the 5 Tamarack Road property from the Town of Claresholm in good faith. We were provided verbal assurance from your predecessor that the property was nontoxic and safe. That has now been called into question as in your own words stated in your letter of June 09, 2009 "there are no historical environmental assessments for the Tamarack Subdivision development". In essence, in the absence of documentation, we are being asked by the current administration to accept verbal innuendo that all provincial environmental guidelines were followed in the development of the Tamarack Subdivision. That is not good enough. We require documentation that provincial environmental guidelines were followed and there is no threat to health from north landfill site contamination.

We wish to reinforce that we are not directing criticism or blame at you or the current administration for what is obviously shortcomings, inactions or poor bookkeeping practices attributable to the previous administration(s). We accept that most of the current Town Executives, Administrators and Councilors may not have been employed by the Town of Claresholm when the Tamarack subdivision was developed. However, the current Town Administration has a responsibility to ensure the health of citizens residing in the Tamarack subdivision is not compromised. It must accept responsibility for the actions, non-actions or shortcomings of previous administrations.

Therefore, it is requested the Town of Claresholm provide us with correspondence stating no toxicity from the north landfill site is present on the property at 5 Tamarack Road that will pose a threat to health and all provincial environmental guidelines were followed in the development of the Tamarack subdivision.

We thank you for your past expedience and assistance in addressing this matter and we look forward to receiving the correspondence requested above.

Subject: <u>Transfer of Water Allocation</u>

As per the request in your letter dated July 7, 2009, enclosed is a revised draft licence for your review. I would draw your attention to conditions 2.7 through 2.10, which have been added to allow for diversion from the current point of diversion on Willow Creek for the time period required until such time as the project if fully operational from Pine Coulee Reservoir. Condition 3.9 has been adjusted to allow for metering of the project at the Town's raw water vault and the Water Treatment Plant.

With regards to the comments provided pertaining to the 10% Water Conservation Holdback, your comments will be considered by the Director at the time that the decision is made regarding the issuing of the transferred licence.

As you are aware, a Temporary Diversion Licence was issued to the Town of Claresholm on August 4, 2009, allowing for diversion from Pine Coulee Reservoir until September 4, 2009. Please note that if the licence for the transfer of the water allocation is issued prior to that date, the Temporary Diversion Licence will be subject to cancellation.

DEFINITIONS

- 1.0 All definitions from the Act and the Regulations apply except where expressly defined in this licence.
- 1.1 In all parts of this licence:
 - (a) "Act" means the Water Act, RSA 2000, c. W-3, as amended;
 - (b) "Application" means the written submissions to the Director in respect of application number 00261922-00-00
 - (c) "Director" means an employee of the Government of Alberta designated as a Director under the Act;
 - (d) "Point(s) of diversion" means the location(s) where water is diverted from the source of water;
 - (e) "Point of use" means the location(s) in which the diverted water is used by the Licensee for the licenced purpose;
 - (f) "Regulations" means the regulations, as amended, enacted under the authority of the Act.

GENERAL

- 2.0 The Licensee shall immediately report to the Director by telephone any contravention of the terms and conditions of this licence at 1-780-422-4505.
- 2.1 The terms and conditions of this licence are severable. If any term or condition of this licence is held invalid, the application of such term or condition to other circumstances and the remainder of this licence shall not be affected thereby.
- 2.2 The Licensee shall not deposit or cause to be deposited any substance in, on or around the source of water that has or may have the potential to adversely affect the source of water.
- 2.3 The licensee shall submit an application to the Director for the removal of the works within six months after ceasing operation of the works or diversion of the water.
- 2.4 This licence is subject to the Use of Works agreement dated August 25, 2008, as amended, between the Town of Claresholm and Her Majesty the Queen in right of Alberta as represented by the Minister of Environment.
- 2.5. The licensee will implement the Town of Claresholm Water Shortage Response Plan (WSRP) dated May 2009, as amended, when the water elevation in Pine Coulee Reservoir is at elevation 1045.0

- 2.6 The licensee will review the WSRP after each implementation of the Plan and provide revisions to the Director for review, approval and implementation.
- 2.7 Subject to condition 3.0, this licence is appurtenant to the diversion works operated by the Town of Claresholm at the point of diversion at NE 23-012-28-W4 up to October 31, 2010.
- The licensee may divert water from the diversion works on Willow Creek at NE 23-012-28-W4 up to October 31, 2010.
- 2.8 The sum of all water diverted up to October 31, 2010 from Willow Creek on the NE 23-012-28-W4 and the NW 35-013-28-W4 will not exceed the total water allocation of 1, 301, 235 cubic metres per year for the project.
- 2.9 The maximum combined rate of diversion from Willow Creek and Pine Coulee Reservoir will not exceed the rate of diversion of 0.12 cubic metres per second as per condition 3.8 of this licence.
- 2.10 The licensee will include in the Annual Water Use Reports for 2009 and 2010 the volume of water diverted and the rate of diversion at the NE 23-012-28-W4 and NW 35-013-28-W4 respectively.
- 2.11 The licensee will submit within eighteen months of the effective date of this licence:
 - (a) An application for the removal of the former diversions works on Willow Creek at NE 23-012-28-W4
 - (b) Plans and supporting documentation for the reclamation of the former diversion works on Willow Creek at NE 23-012-28-W4

DIVERSION OF WATER

- 3.0 This licence is appurtenant to the undertaking as follows:
 - (a) The diversion works operated by the Town of Claresholm at the point of diversion at NW 35-013-28-W4; and
 - (b) The water supply pipeline between the diversion works and the Town of Claresholm at SW 23-012-27-W4 for the delivery of water to the Town of Claresholm
 - (c) The water distribution network in association with the Town of Claresholm municipal water supply within the municipal boundary of the Town of Claresholm.
- 3.1 The Licensee shall divert water only for the purpose(s) specified in this licence.
- 3.2 The Licensee shall divert water only from the source of water specified in this licence.

- 3.3 The Licensee shall divert water only from the NW 35-013-28-W4.
- 3.4 The Licensee shall divert the water only to the point of use at SW 23-012-27-W4.
- 3.5 The works used to divert the water authorized by this licence shall include, at a minimum, all of the following:

- 3.6 The Licensee shall not divert more than 1,301,235 cubic metres of water per year.
- 3.7 Subject to clause 3.8, the Licensee shall not divert water at a rate of diversion greater than 0.08 cubic metres per second
- 3.8 The maximum rate of diversion may be increased from 0.08 cubic metres per second up to 0.12 cubic metres per second only when all licensee and registrants with a numerically lower priority than 2007-12-10-001 in the Willow Creek sub-basin have sufficient water to divert their whole allocation of water specified under the licence or registration
- 3.9 Prior to diverting any water from the source of water, the Licensee shall equip the raw water meter vault for the Town of Claresholm at Station 18+290 and the Water Treatment Plant with measuring devices, which measures:
 - (a) cumulatively, the quantity of all water diverted, and
 - (b) the instantaneous rate of diversion.
- 3.10 The Licensee shall maintain each measuring device referred to in 3.9 when diverting any water.

3.11 The Licensee shall calibrate each measuring device referred to in 3.9 in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.

MONITORING AND REPORTING

- 4.0 Unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Director, the Licensee shall:
 - (a) measure the total volume of water diverted each day using the measuring devices specified in 3.9(a); and
 - (b) measure the rate of diversion on a continuous basis using the measuring devices specified in 3.9(b).
- 4.1 The Licensee shall record and retain all of the following information for a minimum of 5 years after being collected:
 - (a) the place, date and time of all monitoring and measuring;
 - (b) the results obtained pursuant to 4.0; and
 - (c) the name of the individual who conducted the monitoring, measuring and sampling stipulated in (a) and (b).
- 4.2 The Licensee shall compile an Annual Water Use Report on or before February 28th of each year following the calendar year in which the information on which the report is based was collected.
- 4.3 The Licensee shall retain each Annual Water Use Report for a minimum of 5 years.
- 4.4 The Licensee shall submit an Annual Water Use Report to the Director:
 - (a) on or before February 28th of each year following the calendar year in which the information on which the report is based was collected; or
 - (b) within a time period specified in writing by the Director.
- 4.5 The Annual Water Use Report shall include, at a minimum, the following information collected during the previous calendar year:
 - (a) the total annual number of cubic metres of water diverted from the source of water;
 - (b) the results obtained pursuant to 4.0; and
 - (c) any other information required in writing by the Director.

COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION

- 5.0 The Licensee shall:
 - (a) provide to all water users, within a distance specified in writing by the Director from the point of diversion, the contact name(s) and telephone numbers of the licensee or representative(s);
 - (b) investigate all written complaints accepted by the Director relating to allegations of surface water and groundwater interference as a result of the diversion of the water or operation of the works; and
 - (c) provide a written report to the Director, within a time specified in writing by the Director, detailing the results of the investigation relating to the complaint accepted by the Director in 5.0(b).
 - 5.1 The Licensee shall satisfy the Director that the report submitted pursuant to 5.0(c) has identified remedial and/or mitigative measures relating to the alleged interference.

Hi Kris,
Peter and I have reviewed the license draft:

- 1,301,235 cubic meters = 1054.8 acre feet = original license less 10%
- 0.08 m3/s = 2.8 cfs which is 9.3% lower than present license
- you are also allowed 0.12 m3/s (4.2 cfs) at times when all other licenses (before 2007 12 10) are satisfied.
- The Use of Works Agreement with AENV gives the Town the "right" to be connected to their works within their Reservoir right of way.
- Clause 3.9 should be amended to read:

"Prior to diverting any water from the source of water, the Licensee shall equip the water supply pipeline between the diversion works and the Town of Claresholm at SW 23 012 27 W4, with measuring devices at the turnout at Station 18+920 and at the Water Treatment Plant, which measure:

- Cumulatively, the quantity of all water diverted, and
- The instantaneous rate of diversion"

Here it is. I need someone to email me and tell us how many acre feet 1,301,235 cubic meters is.

Also need to know if the diversion rate of .08 is 10% lower than our current license's diversion rate.

Re: Notice of LAPP Contribution Rate Increase

The LAPP Board of Trustees has completed an actuarial valuation of the plan as of December 31, 2008. Based on its review of the actuarial information, the Board has decided to implement a contribution rate increase over a three-year term, commencing January 1, 2010.

The impact of the increase for LAPP members and employers in 2010, as a percentage of pensionable salary, is shown below:

Members' Current Rate	7.46% up to YMPE*	10.66% over YMPE
Members' Rate Jan. 1, 2010	8.06% up to YMPE	11.53% over YMPE
Employers' Current Rate	8.46% up to YMPE	11.66% over YMPE
Employers' Rate Jan. 1, 2010	9.06% up to YMPE	12.53% over YMPE

*YMPE refers to the Year's Maximum Pensionable Earnings level determined by the Canada Pension Plan. In 2009, the YMPE is \$46,300.

The actuarial valuation determined that the plan suffered significant investment losses as a result of the worldwide financial crisis in 2008. These losses, combined with the current low interest rate environment, are the primary reasons behind the contribution rate increase.

The Board has consulted with employers, unions and associations over the best way to introduce contribution rate increases. As stakeholders have consistently recommended moderate, incremental increases over large, one-time increases, the Board has chosen to phase the increase in over a three-year period.

The 2010 – 2012 contribution rates are projected to be sufficient to cover current service costs and eliminate the plan's deficit over a 15 year period. However, our assumptions contain a relatively small amount of margin for

adverse future experience. If interest rates remain at their current low levels, if investment returns are lower than expected, or if demographic experience changes for the worse, future contribution rate increases may be necessary.

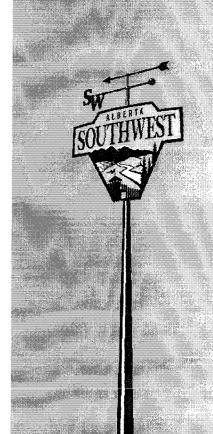

Dear Sir,

- 1. Claresholm Detachment dealt with 233 occurrences in the month of July. In addition to the statistics supply on the attached pages members also wrote 88 traffic tickets on the highways and streets in our Detachment area.
- 2. As you are aware there was a bank robbery in Granum, then an armed robbery at the hotel in Stavely. This matter has been resolved and an individual is charged with these offenses, as well as additional armed robberies in Lethbridge and Strathmore. Lethbridge Major Crimes developed some evidence and Claresholm members, and members from Lethbridge Regional Police arrested the suspect at a residence southwest of Claresholm. This matter is presently before the courts.
- 3. We have had a fairly busy summer with a noticeable increase in thefts from the Industrial and Commercial areas in Claresholm. We have also had a number of thefts in the rural areas from various well sites and camping areas. Our efforts to establish a COP Program for Claresholm are ongoing, we have identified a number of volunteers and are in the process of formalizing this group. We are also continuing to complete our grant application for a full time School Resource Officer and in the near future I will be requesting your signature on a letter of support for this application. We have also had an increase in the number of domestic disturbances in our detachment area.
- 4. Claresholm Detachment is fully staffed, with the exception of our part time clerk position. It is clear that staffing this position will be a long process and as previously mentioned is somewhat out of our control at the local level.
- 5. Claresholm Detachment is now reporting to Inspector Joe McGeough in Lethbridge. He is my direct supervisor and at some point in the future I'm sure you will have the opportunity to meet him.
- 6. Please find attached a statistical breakdown for our calls for service for the month of July. If you have any questions or concerns please give $m \in \mathbb{R}$ call.

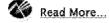

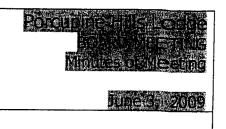
