ACTION ITEMS

TOWN OF CLARESHOLM PROVINCE OF ALBERTA BYLAW #1542

A Bylaw of the Town of Claresholm to rescind Bylaw #1524 and being a Bylaw to establish the Town of Claresholm policies relating to Employees' Benefits;

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and proper to pass a Bylaw to establish policy related to Employees' Benefits;

NOW THEREFORE, under the authority and subject to the provisions of the Municipal Government Act the Council of the Town of Claresholm enacts as follows:

Union Employees

1. Employee conditions and benefits shall relate to the Collective Agreement signed between the Town of Claresholm and the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) Local 3023.

Non-Union Employees – Full Time

- 1. An annual review of wages and salaries shall be made each year in December with increases to be effective January 1st of each year.
- 2. A long service bonus shall be given as per CUPE Local 3023 Collective Agreement.
- 3. The Town shall contribute an amount of one hundred percent (100%) per month for each employee towards the premiums for medical, group insurance and long term disability, the same as CUPE Local 3023 Collective Agreement.
- 4. It shall be a basis of employment of all full-time employees to participate in all medical and group insurance plans after six (6) months and successful completion of probation, as well as pension plans after one year.
- 5. All office employees and FCSS Program Coordinators shall be employed on a 35 hours per week basis and the Superintendent of Public Works shall be employed on a 40 hours per week basis unless otherwise negotiated.
- 6. The Chief Administrative Officer, Superintendent of Public Works, Secretary-Treasurer, Tax / Payroll Administrator, FCSS Director and Aquatic Supervisor will not receive compensation for overtime. No salaried employee will be allowed to bank time unless negotiated and approved by the CAO. All FCSS employees will sign an overtime agreement to allow lieu time. FCSS policy will be followed for lieu time.
- 7. Annual Vacations

a) All employees shall receive vacation the same as CUPE Local 3023 Collective Agreement.

b) Holidays may be taken when mutually agreed upon by the CAO and employee or by Council and the CAO. FCSS employees will take holidays when mutually agreed upon by the FCSS Director and Board.

- 8. Sick Leave will be administered the same as CUPE Local 3023 Collective Agreement.
- 9. Compassionate Leave
 - a) Compassionate leave of five (5) days shall be granted to employees for reasons of illness or death within their family.
 - b) Family shall be considered to mean the following:
 - Spouse
 - Parent, parent-in-law, grandparents, grandparents-in-law or legal guardian
 - Child, grandchild, sister, brother, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, daughter-in-law or son-in-law
- 10. All employees shall be entitled to Federal, Provincial or Municipal government holidays with pay as per the CUPE Local 3023 Collective Agreement. Where any of the above mentioned holidays fall on Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday or Tuesday shall be deemed the holiday.

- 11. Mileage shall be paid to Town employees using their own vehicle for conducting Town business as per Policy #66 Staff Education & Training.
- 12. Maternity Leave as per Alberta Labour Standards.
- 13. Paternity Leave is the same as C.U.P.E. Local 3023 Collective Agreement.
- 14. Other FCSS employee matters will be at the discretion of the FCSS Board (for example annual bonuses).

Non-Union Employees – Part Time and Seasonal

- 1. Non-union part-time and seasonal employees are not eligible for the following benefits:
 - Long service pay
 - Medical, group insurance and long-term disability
 - Annual vacation
 - Pension
 - Sick leave
 - Compassionate leave
 - Paternity leave
- 2. Stat pay will be determined as per Alberta Labour Standards.
- 3. Vacation pay will be paid each period.
- 4. Overtime pay will be determined as per Alberta Labour Standards and must be approved by the CAO. All FCSS employees will sign an agreement to allow lieu time. FCSS policy will be followed for lieu time.
- 5. Other FCSS employee matters (for example annual bonuses) will be at the discretion of the FCSS Board.
- 6. Bylaw #1524 is hereby rescinded.
- 7. This Bylaw shall come into effect on the date of the third reading.

A bylaw to authorize the rates of taxation to be levied against assessable property within the Town of Claresholm for the 2010 taxation year.

WHEREAS, the Town of Claresholm has prepared and adopted detailed estimates of the municipal revenues and expenditures as required, at the Council meeting held on ______, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the estimated municipal expenditures and transfers set out in the budget for the Town of Claresholm for 2010 total \$13,730,068; and

WHEREAS, the estimated municipal revenues and transfers from all sources other than taxation is estimated at \$10,004,232; and the balance of \$3,725,836 is to be raised by general municipal taxation; and

WHEREAS, the requisitions are:

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Claresholm is required each year to levy on the assessed value of all property, tax rates sufficient to meet the estimated expenditures and the requisitions; and

WHEREAS, the Council is authorized to classify assessed property, and to establish different rates of taxation in respect to each class of property, subject to the *Municipal Government Act*, Chapter M26, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the assessed value of all property in the Town of Claresholm as shown on the assessment roll is:

NOW THEREFORE under the authority of the *Municipal Government Act*, the Council of the Town of Claresholm, in the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

OVERVIEW

As requested Administration has compiled a report documenting both general comments and issues with the proposed park and site/project specific pros and cons for the proposed location at the land south of the Water Treatment Plant.

GENERAL ISSUES

General issues include an increase of garbage at the site, potential increase for vandalism and the park becoming a "party area" for people due to its distance from the town proper. Additional staffing costs for cleaning park, maintaining and operating the park, ensuring security at the park (cameras/signage) and costs for electricity, gas etc to operate the amenities within the park.

These issues can come with any public park, however, as outlined in the site specific portion of the report some of these could have more impact due to the incorporation of the Town's raw water supply lake as an amenity and its close proximity to the Town's water treatment plant.

SITE/PROJECT SPECIFIC PROS AND CONS

Pros of the project and/or site

- Creative recreational opportunities for residents
- Educational basis to park
- Although current formal trail system doesn't provide access to this site, many walkers, runners and cyclists use 8th Street as a route. Heavy informal use by pedestrians.
- Does fit within the Town's proposed trail system (walkway path) as 8th Street is a focus currently.

Cons of the project and/or site

- Town has existing recreational uses/facilities that are proposed in the plan (skating rink, football fields)
- Increase in garbage/vandalism is a concern as the raw water lake feeds the south water treatment plant and the proposed park is adjacent to the plant.
- Seasonal risks ensuring users don't skate on the frozen pond or swim in the pond in the summer. BMX track needs to be built by experienced company to ensure participant safety.
- Potential for increased insurance premiums due to amenities in the park and the risks associated with their use by the general public.
- Outside skating rink would entail staff to make and remove the ice.
- High pressure gas main in the area. Would need agreement to build on their easement.
- Park would need to be lighted with traditional electric lights as solar powered lights do not have sufficient lumens to illuminate the area sufficiently.
- In general, when designing parks and walkable communities a "within 10 minute walking distance" is used as a standard for planning. This equates to 3,000 feet. Below is a comparison of the proposed site and two alternative sites.
 - The proposed Kin site only serves 55 residences within this radius (100 more if Bridge Developments build in the future). The Golf Course is the only other community facility in the area and there are no other parks.
 - An alternative site proposed, Patterson Park, serves the entire east side of town within this radius (approximately 250 residences). Other community facilities in this range include the curling rink and arena (winter only), the skateboard park (summer only) and there are no other parks on the east side of town.
 - The second alternative proposed, Westhills/Fedor Park, serves approximately 700 residences within this radius (120 more if Prairie Shores develops). Other community facilities in this range include Millenium Ball Diamonds, tennis courts, football field, track at high school, playground at West Meadow, Lions Park, Elementary School playground, Amundsen Park and Centennial Park.

RECOMMENDATION.

The Westhills site already has adequate recreational opportunities for its residents. The development of the water treatment plant as a park is not recommended because there aren't enough residences within a walkable distance at this time. Also the issues discussed above regarding the proximity to the water treatment plant and the use of the pond as an amenity make this site a higher risk/higher cost placement.

Based on the above information Administration is recommending Patterson Park as the preferred site for a new park. This site has no pond, however, a well planned and developed park in this area would provide recreational opportunities to the east side population as its only park. The toboggan hill, playground, gazebo, BMX track and walking paths could all be accommodated at this site. This site would not have the fish pond and the outdoor skating rink and football/soccer field features are not recommended at any site.

Principal's Message

By May 28, we will ask all materials to be returned to the library, as June will be used to move materials and consolidate the library collections. 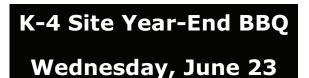

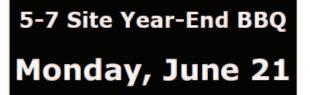

4. Policy and By-law Review and Process Discussion - facilitated by John Carstairs

Revisions to the policies and articles that were discussed at the April 7th Management Board Meeting were distributed via email to the Management Board prior to the meeting.

RE: Articles of Association

Three motions were put forward in the handout of revisions. The intent of these motions is to provide sufficient time for a comprehensive review of the Articles of Association for approval at a general meeting to be scheduled in January 2011. Upon further review, modifications were proposed to Motion 3 to specify that the intent is to call a general meeting early in 2011. Following discussion it was generally agreed that legal advice not be sought at this time, but legal assistance would be a requirement following the comprehensive review.

Motion: # 3- 04/23/2010 Daryl Sutter moved to approve the Notice of Motions as amended. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Actionable: Notice of Motions to be dated and attached to notice of meeting when circulating to the membership.

RE: Policies and Procedures

John Carstairs prepared a Summary of Changes and included these in the 'handout' of revisions. Upon reviewing the definition of employee vs. self-employed from Revenue Canada, John reported that Shilpa Stocker would be classified as self-employed. Reference was made to Shilpa Stocker's April 15th email and her suggestions for items that may be included in the criteria outlined in Appendix A (Criteria for Partnership Agreements). Following discussion, further modifications were recommended to the four policies and appendices included in the summary. Additionally, the following two policies were also debated:

Policy #17 – Policy Topic - *Past winners of the Award of Excellence are not eligible to submit the same nomination* - It was recommended that changes be made in wording to clarify the intent.

Policy #9 – Policy Topic – *Advisory Committees* – the question was raised as to whether or not there is a need to distinguish between advisory committee, ad hoc committee, task force or steering committee? It was the consensus that ad hoc is 'all inclusive'.
